QUALIFICATIONS

The 10th Mountain Division (Light) was reactivated in February 1985 and since then has been the most deployed division in the United States Army. The division will remain extremely active in the years ahead in the Global War on Terrorism.

Unfortunately, the number of 10th Mountain Division (Light) soldiers killed and wounded in action continues to grow as does the number in harm's way.

The 10th Mountain Division (Light) does not have a self-perpetuating fund for scholarships as do many other active Army duty divisions. This is an unfortunate situation that has created an unintended inequity for those who serve America in the 10th Mountain Division (Light).

To correct this inequity, we are raising \$5 million to provide our soldiers and their family members with annual scholarships.

In 2007, five \$5,000 scholarships were awarded and one more has been added each year. Our goal is to award one more each year until we reach fifty \$5,000 scholarships each year.

An applicant must be a current or former 10th Mountain Division (Light) member or the family member of one.

An applicant must be a full-time undergraduate student. Graduate study is not funded. Students attending technical schools are eligible to apply.

New applications are accepted from high school seniors for the freshman year and from traditional and non-traditional students for any year in college or technical school. High school juniors in an early graduation program may also apply.

Any unusual hardships and special family or personal circumstances should be described in the application.

There are no geographical constraints on the applicant's location or school.

Applications are accepted throughout the year, but the cut off for the current academic year is 1 April of that year.

The selection committee will meet in May each year and all applicants will be notified of their status in June.

One half of the scholarship will be sent to the awardees' school in August; the remainder will be sent after first semester grades are received.

Awardees must maintain a 2.5/4.0 to receive the second half of the scholarship unless if he/she is a first term freshman, then 2.0/4.0 is required.
